

TICKET POLICIES

- All cash tickets must be paid for when reservations are made.
- Cash tickets may be paid for over the phone with MasterCard or Visa.
- You may pick your tickets up early or have them held in the box office until performance night. (Membership cards are kept in the box office and are signed when tickets are picked up.)
- Late-comers will be seated at the rear of the auditorium until intermission if space is available.

- Tickets not picked up at all are considered "used" and replacement tickets cannot be issued.
- Tickets may be exchanged for another performance of the same show ONLY if 24-hour notice is given and seating is available.
- If you must cancel on the day of a show, you may request to be placed on stand-by for another performance of the same show. If tickets become available, you will be contacted by phone on the day you have requested.


